21 on Rajah is a Halal-certified restaurant offering an exquisite and lavish blend of Mediterranean and Asian buffet.

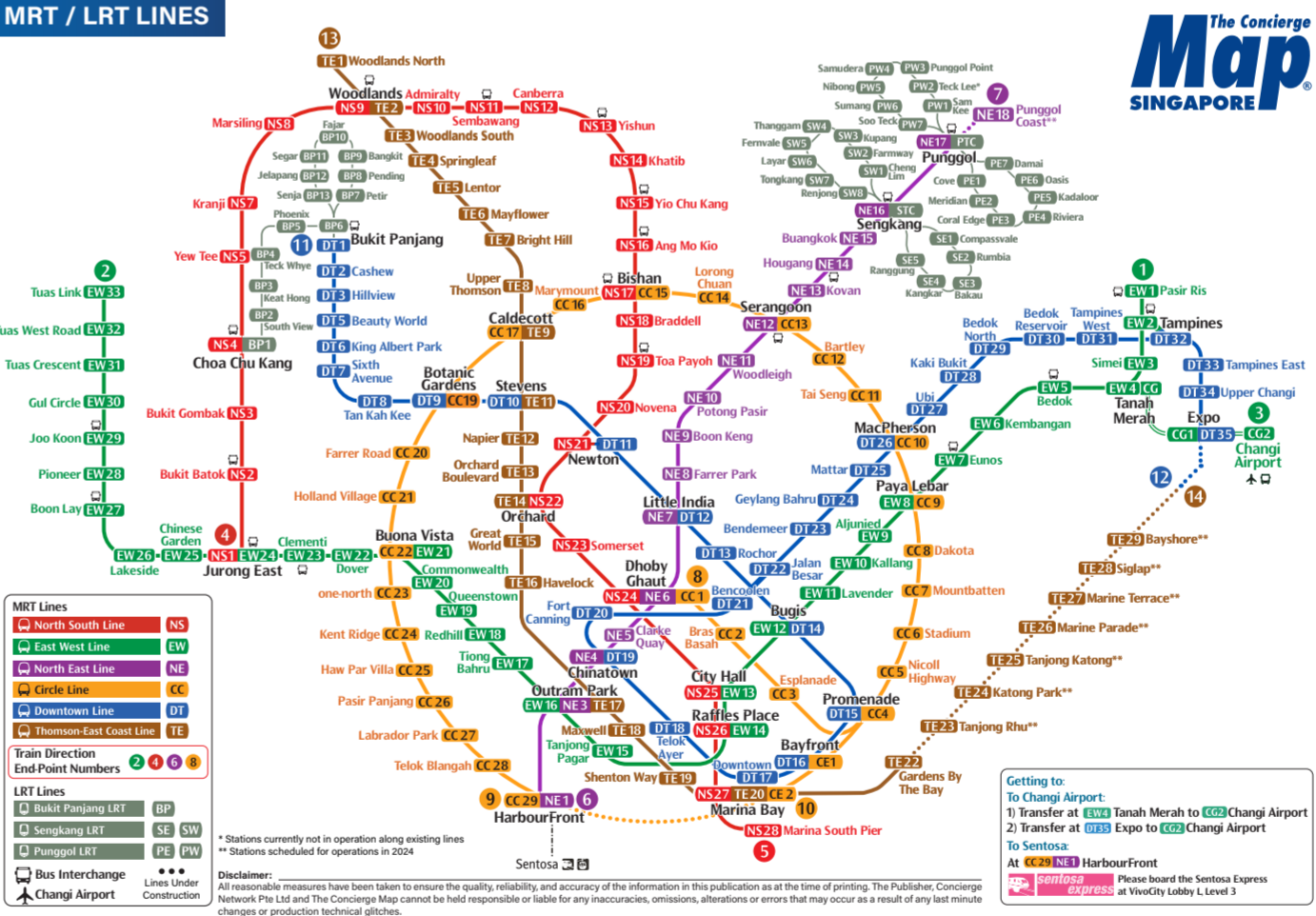

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THINGS TO EXPLORE

- Zhongshan Park (MAP REF: A4)**
Nestled in between our hotel, you will find the scenic and tranquil Zhongshan Park. Look down on the pavement to view plaques that document the life of Dr. Sun.
- Novena Church (MAP REF: E2)**
Dedicated to St. Alphonsus, it is one of the first churches built in Singapore after the WWII in 1950. The popular Saturday Novena sessions attracts as many as 20,000 people each weekend.
- Novena Malls (MAP REF: E3 and F3)**
For a spot of shopping, dining and entertainment, head down to Royal Square, Velocity and Square 2 where a diverse array of restaurants and shops await you. The malls are also linked to Novena MRT Station. Complimentary shuttle service is available to and from the Aloft Singapore Novena, please approach our concierge team for information on the shuttle schedule.

- 21 on Rajah (MAP REF: B4)**
Aloft Singapore Novena (East Wing)
A halal-certified buffet restaurant located at the Aloft Singapore Novena East Wing, 21 on Rajah presents a gastronomic mix of Mediterranean and local cuisine.
- Tau Sar Piaih**
Check with our concierge desk
Also known as Bean Paste Biscuit, there are two kinds of Tau Sar Piaih, a sweet and a salty version to cater for different taste buds. What's your preferred flavour?
- Sun Yat Sen Nanyang Memorial Hall (MAP REF: A4)**
Declared a National Monument in 1994, the villa was the local headquarters of Dr. Sun Yat Sen. The museum now offers a closer look at the life of Dr. Sun and the contributions made the Chinese communities in the Southeast Asia to the 1911 Revolution which overthrew the Qing Dynasty.
- Burmese Buddhist Temple (MAP REF: A4)**
With history dating back to 1875, the temple is the only Buddhist temple outside of Myanmar built in traditional Burmese architectural style, complete with eye-catching golden spire and an 11-foot (3m) tall marble statue of Buddha weighing 10 tonnes.
- Singapore Icons Mural Art at EASB (MAP REF: A3)**
For an insta-ready image featuring Singapore's famous landmarks, visit EASB located just a street away from the Aloft Singapore Novena.
- Kwan Im Tng Temple (MAP REF: B4)**
The Kwan Im Tng Temple at Balestier Road is one of the many Chinese temples in Singapore dedicated to Guanyni, the Goddess of Mercy.
- Shaw Plaza (MAP REF: C7)**
Prominently located in Balestier, Shaw Plaza is a family mall with a wide variety of services, education, entertainment, and F&B destinations.
- Shaw Malay Studios (MAP REF: B7)**
In the 1950s, the Shaw Brothers Film Studio at Jalan Ampas produced many of the films that made up the Golden Age of Singapore and Malay language cinema.
- Masjid Hajjah Rahimabi Kebun Limau (MAP REF: B9)**
Built in 1984, the mosque was named after Kebun Limau which means lime garden in Malay, an old place name for the area which had many lime trees in the late 1800s. It was also named after philanthropist Hajjah Rahima Bee Ahmad Angllia.
- Balestier Bak Kut Teh (MAP REF: C6)**
Open 24hrs Daily
The Balestier Bak Kut Teh was created 50 years ago, largely influenced by the sugarcane plantations that historically dominated the Balestier Road area and the stories of tigers that roamed in them.
- Balestier Market (MAP REF: B5)**
Built in 1922 for local farmers to sell their produce and served as a food-rationing centre during World War II, the converted building houses food stalls serving a variety of mouth-watering local favourites.
- Whampoa Drive Makan Place (MAP REF: D8 and D9)**
Among the affordable delights found in the food centre, the Rojak (fruit and vegetable salad), Duck Rice, Nasi Padang and Fish Head Steamboat are the much-loved favourites of locals and tourists alike.



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
